What is OSS exactly?

- Open Source Initiative (OSI): http://opensource.org
- Consortium
- 3 basic rights:
 - read (source code)
 - redistribute
 - modify ("derived work")
- Example of OSI licenses (58):
 - CDDL, GPLv2, MPL, BSD, IBM PL, ...





- Lots of reasons, matter of perspective:
 - Student
 - Developer
 - Manager
 - Security Consultant





- Students:
 - learn & research: examine the code
- Developer:
 - "upstream maintenance"
 - maturity of code: peer principle
 - clearly defined APIs, document formats
- Manager:
 - licensing costs, well... maybe
 - readability of documents in 10 years
 - communication and exchangeability of documents by open standards, not by market dominance



- Security Consultant:
 - several studies show in general:

```
Security[OS Unix] » Security[Windows]
```

- can look into the code:
 - verify Kerckhoff's principle
 - no hidden backdoors/covert channels





- Bugtraq 2004 (Netgear WG602):
 - "Any user logging in with the username "super" and the password "5777364" is in complete control of the device.
 - "Bugfix" of Netgear: "I can confirm that this vulnerability still exists in the latest firmware upgrade(1.7.14) for the WG602. They've simply gone and changed the username to superman and password to 21241036.
- Not unique, see e.g. Cisco's WLSE/HSE 🗹

- world biggest OS event w/ up to 20k visitors
- BSD track, OpenSolaris track

Projects

- LiMux 🗹: 14k Desktops incl. OpenOffice, 2008
- (Vienna/Austria has Wiemux)
- SINA



Example Germany



- migration guide for servers and desktops (KBSt) public administrations
 - 504 pages(!)
- ministry secretaries on several occasions:
 "embrace open standards and APIs"
- e-government exchange standard: ODF/OASIS
- recently also: EU



Suse

- based in Nuremberg, since 1994
- now Novell daughter
- 1996 first Suse Linux distribution

Debian (^O

- big development basis, strong user community
- (Ian Murdock: Founder of Debian, now for Sun)

KDE



- started by a German 1996: Kool Desktop Environment
- KDE e.V. registered in Germany, brand owner
- strong user community

Star-/OpenOffice

- located in Hamburg/Germany
- ~12 mio LoC (Linux kernel: 7,8 mio)



II. Example Germany



- OpenSolaris community
 - significant German distributions from outside Sun
 - Solaris distributions:
 - SchilliX (x86)
 - marTuX (SPARC)
 - first OpenSolaris book

- status de.opensolaris.org = ru.opensolaris.org
- UG meetings:
 - no GOSUG meeting yet, but:
 - within GUUG ~ 10 local meetings
 - OpenSolaris install/build workshops
 - IPFilter presentations (Darren Reed)
 - SMF and others workshops
- since a few years OpenSolaris track @ LinuxTag



Example Germany



unfortunately:

- gaps/hostilities between different communities
 - BSD vs. Linux
 - Linux vs. Solaris and vice versa
- pity, because people can learn from projects
- personal issues rule over technical matters
- GUUG is trying to bridge them
- not only in Germany!











• **GUUG** (**G**erman **U**nix **U**ser **G**roup)

- non-profit association of Unix users, profession
- organizes conferences >20 years
- international *Linux-Kongress* since 1994
- international FOSTEL since 2004
- (coming up: IPv6-, LDAP conference)
- Solaris: job-related interest (members driven)
- OpenSolaris: community driven
- → time to make things happen!

- February 2007, Berlin/Germany
